CS Munya Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Cooperatives on 21st January, 2021 in a media briefing said that the country is under the second wave of Desert Locust Invasion which entered from Ethiopia and Somalia in mid-November 2020.

CS said the Government and FAO have trained over 500 NYS Personnel who have been deployed in all field bases in the country. The CS stated more NYS Personnel will be trained and deployed accordingly.

CS in his brief said the Government has established control bases to coordinate desert locust management operations by Deploying several surveillance and spray aircrafts, and vehicles mounted with sprayers for ground operations.

CS Munya launches Tea Regulations under Tea Act 2020

CS Peter Munya Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Cooperatives on 7th January, 2021 launched the Public Participation for Tea Elections Regulations under the Tea Act 2020 during a media briefing at Kilimo.

CS in his speech said that the Tea Act came to force on 24th December, 2020 after approval by both National Assembly and the Senate. He said that the Tea Act is a culmination of long process towards reforms in the Tea Sector whose objective is to bring about good governance and efficiency in the Tea Value Chain.

CS stated that a public notice to invite comments from stakeholders on Draft Tea (Tea Factory Limited Company Election) Regulations, 2021 under the Tea Act 2020 will be held to incorporate stakeholder's views in the final document. Thereafter regulations will be submitted to parliament for scrutiny

CS Peter Munya Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Cooperatives commissioned leather footwear and goods manufacturing facilities at Animal Health and Industry Training Institute (AHITI) Kabete.

CS said the facility will be used to train youths in leather processing for both domestic and international market.

CS stated that a land audit will be done in an effort to reclaim public land allocated for national veterinary services.



CS Munya Commissions several fishing boats at Liwatoni in Mombasa County

CS Peter Munya Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Cooperatives commissioned several fishing boats at Liwatoni in Mombasa. These boats are fitted with safety equipment's and can cruise over 10 tons of fish.

CS said the Government is refurbishing and rehabilitating Liwatoni Fishing Port for a vibrant marine fishing industry.

CS told the Fishing Community at Liwatoni to make use of the fishing facilities and equipment's provided by the Government to create wealth, jobs, food and nutrition security in order to realize the Big 4 Agenda.

CS Munya Flags of Bt. Cotton to counties at Kilimo alongside AFA Task Force

CS Peter Munya Ministry for Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Cooperatives launched the Commercial Bt Cotton at Kilimo.

In this Launch there were several key stakeholders namely the Task Force for Agriculture and Food Authority (AFA).

The CS in his speech said that growing of Bt cotton field trials have being done in several counties and there is notably a potential for High Germination rate for Bt.Cotton.

The CS added that Bt. Cotton crop can be used locally by Revatix and Private companies and can also be exported in other countries just like Burkina Faso and Mali some of the African countries exporting the Bt. Cotton.



CS Munya during public participation on Coffee Draft Bill 2020

CS Munya Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Cooperatives toured several counties during public participation on coffee draft bill 2020.

CS explained to the farmer's that a board known as Coffee Board of Kenya will be established.

The Coffee Board of Kenya will regulate and promote development of coffee industry, issue permits and licenses.

Coffee Board of Kenya will also register coffee dealers, conduct local and international promotional activities.

The Board will also use application of the Kenya Coffee Mark of Origin and coordinate capacity building for players in the coffee value chain.



CS LAUNCHES COCONUT REVOLVING FUND AT KWALE

CS Peter Munya Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Co-operatives launched Coconut Revolving Fund at Kwale.

The CS said he is fully cognizant of the Value attached to Coconut Crop in Coastal region and potential value of the Coconut Crop in the National Economy.

CS in his speech stated that once Coconut Production is increased stakeholders should invest in value addition.

CS added that a Fund is due for public participation with amendments to the crops Act, 2013 to ensure farmers needs for affordable credit is addressed. The beneficiaries of the revolving fund were presented with a Cheque to the Commodities Fund.

The main Socio-Economic benefits of the company and its alignment to the Big 4 Agenda is that it ensures consumers have Food Nutritional value by availing its products from farmers to the domestic market.



CAS ON ASTGS AS ENABLER TO NEW TECHNOLOGIES, INPUTS& BETTER TECHNIQUES OF PRODUCTION

CAS Anne Nyaga Ministry of Agriculture, State Department for Crop Development and Agricultural Research in an official high opening panel forum told the stakeholders present. That increasing agricultural productivity is a priority agenda of the Government of Kenya.

The CAS said that Agricultural Sector Transformation and Growth Strategy 2019-2029 (ASTGS) seeks to guide the sector in achieving 100% food and nutrition security which aims to inform and bring to life the food security pillar of the Big Four Agenda.

CAS provided the farmers with several learning tools to enrich their knowledge in kitchen garden techniques and also gave them some seeds for planting.

CAS told the farmers that 4k clubs will be operational again and training programs in farming will be put in place for the success of the 4K clubs.

A COFFEE FARMER IN NYERI COUNTY

Mr. Charles Mugo a Coffee Farmer in Nyeri County, Mathira East Iriani ward says that Coffee Reforms Bill by the Government has brought great hope to the coffee farmers in Nyeri County.

Mr. Mugo has two variety types of coffee (SL28) and Ruiru 11 which is only 2yrs old but in about 7yrs it will be about 8fit fully grown coffee tree.

The Farmer says he harvests coffee in two seasons that is within the months of June and the main seasons on December.

Mr. Mugo was able to produce around 924 kilos of coffee but he targets to get 1200 kilos of coffee this year. When asked how he will get to his goal.

Mr. Mugo says that now as a coffee farmer he is motivated to go back to the farm because the coffee reforms grant him good returns.

The Coffee farmer is optimistic that the coffee reforms will enable him get reasonable loans with low interests.



SISTER NGAVA IN TOMATOE GREEN HOUSE

Sister Ngava the Headmistress at ST. Teresa's Catholic Primary Girls Boarding School in Nyeri County and her staff decided to source for funds and build a greenhouse in the school compound.

Sister Ngava says the staff had some free time during covid 19 when the school was closed and the learners were home.

The Headmistress said she does not regret on investing resources and time on the greenhouse. This is because she has harvested a number of onions for consumption by her and the staff and also for sale to the nearby community. Currently the Headmistress and the staff have planted tomatoes and some of them are ready for harvest.

The Tomatoes will be consumed by the staff, school children and some will be for sale.



Discolored Tomatoe Leaves attacked by Tutor Absoluter Pest

In the greenhouse the Tomatoes are sometimes attacked by Tutor Absoluter Pest. In Nyeri this is an identified pest that attacks most farmers' tomatoes.

The pest lowers the quality of tomatoes and sometimes the crop is destroyed even before maturity hence the farmer does not get any returns from the crop but in the Greenhouse at St Teresa's, the Headmistress and the staff are able to identify the pest tomato.

Once the pest attack tomatoes the color of tomato leaves is no longer green therefore farm pest control experts are alerted.



Mr. Kusenga a Mixed Crops Fruit Farmer

Mr. Jackson Kusenga is a crop farmer from Iveti Sub-County, Machakos County. Mr. Kusenga expertise, is in mixed crop farming and livestock rearing. Mr. Kusenga was born on 1st June, 1934.

He was employed by British Colonial Government on 1st June 1956. He later was employed as an Agriculture Officer.
